4. Candidates must follow the instructions strictly as given in this Information Bulletin and also the updates published on KEA Website <http://kea.kar.nic.in>. Candidates not complying with the instructions shall be summarily disqualified.
5. Candidates must retain the following documents with them as reference for future correspondence.
 - (i) At least three printouts of the finally submitted online Application.
 - (ii) Proof of fee paid
 - (iii) 2-3 copies of identical Photograph that was scanned and uploaded on the Online Application.
6. (a) Candidate must ensure that mobile numbers, e-mail address entered in the online application form are his/her own as in case of urgency KEA may send information / communications by SMS or mail on given mobile number and mailing ID only.
(b) The Candidate / parents are solely responsible for non-receipt of latest information due to wrong mobile number or mailing address filled in the Online Application Form.
7. Candidates must preserve the Admit Card till the admission is made in College or Institution.

LEGAL JURISDICTION

Any dispute that may arise in respect of the test or the later seat selection process, admission, fees and cancellation is subject to the jurisdiction of the Hon'ble High court of Karnataka. The issuance of admission order by the KEA shall enable the candidate to join the concerned college, subject to the academic eligibility, etc., being approved by the concerned University as per the Regulations.

APPEAL

Any person aggrieved by the order or decision of the Executive Director under CET-2006 Rules may within 15 days from the date of such order or decision, appeal to the Principal Secretary to Government, Education Department (Higher Education), Government of Karnataka, who after calling for records from the Executive Director and after examining the same, shall pass orders as he / she deems fit, which shall be final.

SEAT CANCELLATION, FORFEITURE and FIVE TIMES PENALTY

As per rule 12 of sub-rule (5) of CET-2006 rules, if a candidate who has been allotted a seat in any discipline in an Engineering College or Institution, surrenders the seat after completion of mop-up round (final round) / Casual Vacancy Round, the Executive Director shall forfeit the entire fee paid and the candidate shall be liable to pay a penalty of FIVE times of the annual course fee. Please read **"A NOTE ON SEAT CANCELLATION, REFUND AND FORFEITURE OF FEE"** given in this bulletin with regard to cancellation and forfeiture clause.

BEWARE OF TOUTS, BROKERS OR MIDDLEMEN

Few persons may approach you saying they have known people in KEA who guarantee Engineering / Architecture / Farm Science / Veterinary / Medical / Dental etc seats through unfair means during counseling. Counseling for all courses are conducted and distributed as per the calendar of events in the ambit of the State Government rules as per UGCET / UGNEET merit score and option entry exercised by the candidate. Hence, candidates and parents should not trust any persons. In case you have any information regarding such persons please intimate immediately to KEA e-mail.

SUPERNUMERARY QUOTA (SNQ):

5% of the seats in each college and in each course will be reserved as Supernumerary Quota (SNQ) in all Engineering Colleges. This quota is over and above the seat matrix issued by the Government. The tuition fee prescribed by the Government in that particular college will be waived off. The candidate has to pay University / other fees only. This Supernumerary quota is not available in for Architecture Course. All poor and meritorious candidates including General Merit are eligible for allotment of seats under Supernumerary quota (Tuition Fee Waiver Scheme) whose annual income of the family from all the sources is less than Rs.8.00 Lakhs. All the eligible candidates whose income is less than Rs.8.00 Lakhs, should obtain income certificate from the concerned Tahasildar and enter the RD number of the income certificate to become eligible for Supernumerary Quota (SNQ).

WHAT'S NEW THIS YEAR?

- *Online application is application-cum-verification module. The student entries pertaining to school study, Kannada Medium, Rural Study etc will be verified through SATS and Caste, Income, 371 (J), NCLC will be verified through based on RD Number through Revenue Department Web service. The candidates are advised to fill.*
- *Application is common to all the Professional Courses. Viz Engineering, Medical, Dental, AYUSH, Nursing, Agriculture, Veterinary, Pharmacy, Nursing, BPT, BPO, BSc., Allied Health Science etc. Candidates have to register, submit the application and pay the fees through online. There will be no physical verification as this is application-cum-verification module. The candidates are advised to fill all the details carefully.*
- *After submission of application "Claim Certificate" will be enabled to candidates. Candidates have to download the "Claim Certificate" from KEA Website.*
- *In the claim certificate if it is printed as "Successfully Verified", then such candidates need not visit any office / college for verification. Verification slip can be downloaded from the KEA Website (after announcement of CET results) in due course.*
- *In case in the claims certificate if it is printed as "Claimed Verified or Claimed not Verified or not claimed", then such candidates have to compulsorily submit CET-2025 application form along with all the relevant original documents at the college where they are studying 2nd PUC or 12th standard. College authorities will verify the originals based on claims certificate and approve the details through portal.*
- *Respective reserved category seats will be allotted to SC, ST and Cat-1 candidates based on the Caste Certificate, however to avail the benefit of fee exemption, candidate should obtain income certificate and enter the RD number of the income certificate carefully in the online application.*
- *The Government in its Order No. ಹಿಂವಕ 304 ಬಿಸಿಎ 2017 ಬೆಂಗಳೂರು, ದಿನಾಂಕ 14-09-2018, has enhanced the annual income limit from `6.00 Lakhs to `8.0' Lakhs per annum for claiming reservation benefit. The candidate and his / her father's - mother's Gross Annual Income is below Rs.8.00 Lakhs are eligible to claim benefit of reservation under 2A, 2B, 3A and 3B categories.*
- *OTP will be sent to the candidate registered mobile number and after verification candidate will be allowed to proceed to enter the details online. Hence, the candidate has to provide their mobile number only. One Mobile number should be used for one application only. Change of mobile number will not be entertained.*
- *Regarding the syllabus to be adopted for Common Entrance Test-2025, the subject experts of the Department of School Education (Pre-University) have reviewed the Syllabus of PCMB subjects adopted for the 1st and 2nd PUC classes in Karnataka state and the syllabus to be adopted for CET-2025 has been published on the KEA Website for the information of the students.*

General Instructions

1. All candidates are directed to see the website of KEA <http://http://cetonline.karnataka.gov.in/kea/> frequently for updates. Likewise the instruction / information will also be sent to the mobile number furnished by the candidates in the online application form. KEA or the Government shall not be responsible for any action / consequence resulting due to non-diligent follow up of notices, notifications and publications appearing on the KEA website on CET-2025 by the Candidates.
2. The candidates must compulsorily verify their qualifying examination marks printed on the result sheets without fail, if there is any discrepancy with reference to qualifying examination marks, the same should be brought to the notice of this office immediately for assignment of new ranks, if necessary.
3. If the qualifying examination marks of the candidates change after revaluation or re-totaling then the candidates are required to submit a copy of the latest marks card indicating the change in marks if any to the KEA for assignment of revised / new rank.

4. All the candidates (GM, SC, ST Category – I, 2A, 2B, 3A & 3B category candidates) must compulsorily submit the STUDY CERTIFICATE (when SATS data is not available) obtained from the head of the institution which should be countersigned by concerned Block Educational Officer (BEO) from where the candidate has passed the 10th standard / SSLC examination, by mentioning the Standards, Academic years, Mother Tongue as per the admission register of the institution. (as per format shown at page 49)
5. The candidates who claim seat under rural category will have to obtain a rural study certificate from the respective school / high school issued by the head of the institution which should be countersigned by concerned Block Educational Officer (BEO) as per format shown at page 57.
6. General merit candidates who claim seat in rural category should also submit **Non Creamy Layer Certificate** (NCLC) which contains RD number, obtained from the concerned Tahasildar along with the rural study certificate, page 57. RD number needs to be entered in the online application.
7. The candidates who have studied in the areas mentioned in Page 55-56 during their school days are not eligible to claim rural category seat. However, if the place where the candidate had studied from 1st to 10th standard comes under rural area at the time of his / her studies, he / she will be eligible under rural quota, even though the same place has been declared as urban area in later days.
8. Candidates belonging to reserved categories should possess valid Caste / Caste Income Certificate as the case may be, issued by the Concerned Tahasildar in Form 'D' for SC, ST; Form 'E' for Category-I and Form 'F' for 2A, 2B, 3A and 3B categories, and Caste / Caste income certificate should be in the name of the candidate only. Further, they should have claimed their reservation in the application form; also enter the correct RD number without fail during entry of online application form.
9. Candidates claiming Kalyana-Karnataka Region Reservation (Article 371 (j)) must possess the certificate [Annexure – A (eligibility certificate – rule 3(3))] issued by the concerned Assistant Commissioner, and they should claim the reservation and also enter the correct RD number without fail during entry of online application form.
10. KEA will allot the seats ONLINE in the order of merit and based on the priority of options obtained from the candidates. Candidates have to enter the options of their choice on the specified URL at KEA Website on their own arrangements. Candidates will have the choice to enter as many numbers of options as they desire. Candidates may note that they should enter their options carefully by following the prescribed procedures.
11. The candidate who has obtained a seat in any discipline through KEA (CET Cell) in any of the previous year's shall not be eligible to continue in the course to which he / she has been admitted during the previous years immediately upon selection of a seat in any different discipline during the current year.
12. A candidate may have option to select Medical / Engineering etc; seat in other boards like JEE, NEET, COMED-K and KEA etc. If the candidate is allotted seat in such boards, he should cancel the seat allotted from KEA before the mop-up round / final round, failing which it may amount to blocking of seat and Government may initiate both civil and criminal action against such candidates.
13. If a candidate decides to surrender the seat, he / she has to surrender the seat only to KEA through online by filling the required details. Merely not reporting to the selected / allotted college should not be presumed by the candidate that he / she has surrendered the seat to KEA.
14. No requests for Mutual Transfer of seats will be entertained by KEA at any point of time.
15. All the admissions / allotments made to and by the colleges shall be subject to approval by the Government / concerned University / Apex Bodies.

NOTE ON APPLYING FOR MEDICAL / DENTAL / AYUSH COURSES

1. Government in their letter No. HFW 124 RGU Bangalore, dated 28-06-2017, have directed KEA to conduct Common Counseling for admission to UG Medical and Dental courses for all Government, Private (Including Minority), NRI and Others seats in the State of Karnataka
2. As per the directions of the Government, KEA is holding counseling for admissions to Medical and Dental courses for the year 2025-26. The candidates who will score more than or equal to the prescribed minimum score in UGNEET-2025 will be eligible for admission to UG Medical and Dental and Ayurveda, Unani and Homeopathy degree courses for the year 2025-26.
3. Further, as per the letter dated 13-07-2023 of Karnataka AYUSH Department, the seat matrix for 85% of seats available for admission in Government and Government Aided Institutions (except 15% All India Quota) and in Private Institutions all seats (including State Quota, All India Quota and Management / NRI quota) available for UG courses in Private Ayurveda, Unani and Homeopathy Colleges of Karnataka state shall be allotted through KEA. UGNEET-2025 eligible candidates can also register online for Ayurveda, Unani and Homeopathy seats. However, non-Karnataka candidates are eligible only for the notified seats.
4. Non-Karnataka candidates will not be eligible for reservation. Hence, in the UGNEET-2025 examination, if they score the required minimum 50th percentile or above, fixed for 'GENERAL (UR)' category as per the qualifying criteria, then only they will be eligible to register for admissions through KEA or for any other seats in the State of Karnataka. Please note that SC/ST/OBC eligibility criteria are applicable to Karnataka SC/ST/OBC candidates only.
5. Mere registering does not confer any right on the candidate unless the candidate fulfils eligibility conditions / submission of certificates / completes the document verification.
6. Before registering through online for admission to Medical / Dental / AYUSH courses in the state of Karnataka, applicants should know the eligibility criteria for admission to these courses.

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The Karnataka Common Entrance Test 2025 is being conducted for the purpose of determining the eligibility / merit, for admission of Karnataka candidates and the ward/s of Jammu & Kashmiri Migrants to the First Year or First Semester of full time courses for Government share of seats in Engineering, Technology, Architecture, Bachelor of Yoga and Naturopathy (BNYS), B.Sc. (Nursing), Bachelor of Veterinary Science and Animal Husbandry (B.V.Sc. & A.H.), Farm Science courses i.e., [i.e., B.Sc. (Hons) Agriculture, B.Sc. (Hons) Sericulture, B.Sc. (Hons) Horticulture, B.Sc. (Hons) Forestry, B.Tech (Bio-Technology), B.Sc.(Hons) Community Science, B.Tech (Agricultural Engineering), B.Tech (Food Technology), B.Tech (D. Tech), B.F.Sc (Fisheries), B.Sc. (Hons) Agri. Business Management] B. Pharma, Pharma-D and 2nd year B-Pharma (Lateral Entry) course, in Government / University / Private Aided / Private Un-Aided Professional Educational Institutions in the State of Karnataka for the academic year 2025-26.
- 1.2 Admission to Government seats shall be made in accordance with the Karnataka Selection of Candidates for Admission to Government Seats in Professional Educational Institutions Rules, 2006 (in short CET-2006 Admission Rules) as amended from time to time and therefore the details and instructions contained in this Information Bulletin are subject to the said Rules and Government orders. In case of any discrepancy, the Rules shall prevail.
- 1.3 As per the seat matrix issued by the Government, the seat allotment to the above mentioned courses will be done ONLINE in the order of merit / rank obtained in 2025 CET / NEET / NATA as applicable, and based on the options entered by the candidates through KEA Web-portal.
- 1.4 Only upon possessing of verification slip, candidate will be allowed to enter the options. Candidates can enter any number of options of their choice through KEA Web-portal on their own arrangement. The candidate also has a provision to take a print out in each round. Every candidate shall be given high security user ID and Secret Key using which the candidate has to login and change the password as per his / her choice.
- 1.5 Candidates are advised to verify and confirm themselves that they are fulfilling any one of the Eligibility Clauses before applying for admission to Government seats in Professional Colleges in the state of Karnataka for the year 2025. For any reason the fee paid by the candidates will not be refunded.
- 1.6 *The SC / ST/Category-I / 2A, 2B, 3A and 3B and other eligibility criteria is applicable to Karnataka candidates who are eligible to claim eligibility for Government seats under clauses (a), (b), (f), (h), (j), (k) (l) and (o) and the same is not applicable to eligibility clauses (c), (d), (e), (g), (i), (m) and (n) to claim Government Seats and Government quota seats as per proviso of rule 9 (2) of CET-2006 Admission Rules.*
- 1.7 Reservation of seats in certain categories such as Rural, Kannada etc and in Special Categories like NCC, Sports, Physically Disabled etc are applicable only to Karnataka candidates who are eligible for Government seats and Government Quota seats (rule 5 of CET-2006 rules).
- 1.8 The information furnished by the candidate in the CET-2025 online application form with regard to Caste / Category and Annual Income remains the same for the purpose of assignment of ranks / selection or allotment of a seat and no change will be entertained in future for any reason. Hence the candidates are informed to enter the details correctly and exercise the options in the order of priority.
- 1.9 Any application not in compliance with the conditions specified in the information bulletin is liable to be rejected.

1.10 Admission to B.Sc. (Nursing) courses through Common Entrance Test -2025

As per Government order No., MED 51 RGU 2023 dated 13-04-2023 for admission to B.Sc. (Nursing) courses also candidates who are interested to take admission to B.Sc. (Nursing) courses have to register for CET-2025 and submit / enter the application details through online in KEA portal and they have to appear for Common Entrance Test for PCB subjects conducted by KEA.

Eligibility: Applicant should have passed in Physics, Chemistry and Biology and English papers individually and must have obtained a minimum of 45% aggregate marks in PCB papers at the II PUC or 12th Standard i.e. (10+2). The candidate belonging to SC/ST or other backward classes shall obtain 40% marks in PCB papers together in the qualifying examination. Please note that SC/ST/OBC eligibility criteria are applicable to Karnataka SC/ST/OBC candidates only.

Non-Karnataka candidates will not be eligible for reservation. Further, non-Karnataka candidates will also be not eligible for Government share of seats to B.Sc. (Nursing) course through KEA.

2. DISCLAIMER

- 2.1 The responsibility of KEA is limited to the conduct of counseling, which includes online registration, document verification, online counseling procedure, seat allotment and issue of admission order as per Government Rules.

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- **KANNADA LANGUAGE TEST:** The candidates claiming eligibility for Government seats under Horanadu & Gadinadu Kannadiga clauses and whose mother tongue is Kannada, Tulu, Kodava or Beary, will have to undergo a Kannada language test, to establish their ability to speak, read and write Kannada. The Kannada Language test will be conducted by KEA as per the above schedule at Belagavi, Bijapura, Mangalore, Bengaluru Centres; therefore such candidates will have to appear for the '**Common Entrance Test - 2025**' in a test centre located at Bengaluru, Belagavi, Bijapura, Mangalore Centres Only.

Minimum of 50% marks in Practical Examination is required to claim seat under Agriculturist Quota. Further, Agriculturist Quota is applicable only for Under Graduate courses detailed in 3 and 4 below. Practical Examination will be conducted at Bangalore, Hassan, Mandya, Raichur, Mysore, Munirabad (Koppal District), Arabhava (Gokak Tq) Tamaka (Kolar District), Mangalore, Bidar, Bagalkot, Dharwad, Vijayapura, Hiriya (Chitradurga) and Shimoga by concerned Agricultural / Veterinary Universities.

6. ELIGIBILITY CLAUSES AS PER RULE 5 (1) OF CET-2006 ADMISSION RULES TO CLAIM FOR GOVERNMENT SEATS

- 6.1 No candidate shall be eligible for admission to Government Seats unless he is a Citizen of India and satisfies any one of the following conditions. Eligibility for OCI / PIO candidates for Government seats shall be as per the directions of the Government.
- 6.2 Each condition is specified as a clause and is individually referred by a code. The documents to be submitted at the respective college for verification in support of the claim for each of the Clauses are also detailed below the respective clauses.
- 6.3 The candidates who do not satisfy any of the Clauses / Eligibility Criteria detailed below and the candidates who do not submit the prescribed documents in original at the respective college will not be eligible for admission to professional courses under Government quota seats.
- 6.4 Other than the certificate mentioned in clauses, if a candidate claiming seat under Article 371 (j) Kalyana-Karnataka reservation, candidate should obtain eligibility certificate from the concerned Assistant Commissioner in Annexure-A with RD Number. The candidates have to enter RD Number in the application form.

7. NATA FOR ADMISSION TO ARCHITECTURE

For admission to Architecture course candidate should compulsorily qualify in NATA-2025 (National Aptitude Test in Architecture). The eligibility conditions as stipulated by Council of Architecture, New Delhi will apply. (Visit COA or NATA Website for more details.)

Further the candidates must compulsorily register for CET-2025, fill the application through online and pay the application fees. Furthermore the candidates should enter and submit the NATA score card to the KEA on the specified dates.

8. ACADEMIC ELIGIBILITY AS PER RULE 3 OF CET-2006 ADMISSION RULES – WHO CAN APPLY?

- (i) No candidate shall be eligible for admission to Government Seats unless he is a citizen of India.
- (ii) The candidates who have passed the qualifying examination other than the universities listed in the notification at VTU Website are NOT eligible and candidates who have passed from Karnataka State Open University (KSOU) are also NOT eligible.
- (iii) A candidate who is expecting the qualifying examination results, (i.e., 2nd PUC / 12th Standard in 2025), may apply and appear for Common Entrance Test 2025 but he/she shall not be eligible for admission to any of the course specified in 1 above, if he/she does not pass the qualifying examination with the required pass percentage of marks.
- (iv) The educational qualifications / eligibility criteria prescribed by the Competent Authority in regulations / guidelines issued from time to time will be applicable in deciding the eligibility.
- (v) Eligibility / admissions / allotments made to and by the colleges shall be subject to approval by NMC / DCI / AICTE / COA / CCIM / Government / concerned University / Apex Bodies / etc.

E. is eligible for admission to Naturopathy & Yoga courses. 40% of marks in Q. E. in case of SC, ST, Category-I and OBC (2A, 2B, 3A and 3B) Category candidates.

c) For admission to B.Sc. (Hons) Agriculture, B.Sc. (Hons) Sericulture, B.Sc (Hons) Horticulture, B.Sc (Hons) Forestry, B.Tech. Biotechnology, B.Sc. (Hons) Community Science, B.Tech (Agri. Engg), B.Tech (Food Technology), B.Tech (Dairy Technology), B.F.Sc. (Fisheries), B.Sc. (Hons) Ag. Business Management, candidates who have passed the Q. E. with Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics and Biology as optional subjects are eligible.

Based on the performance of the candidates in Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics and Biology subjects in both Common Entrance Test and the Qualifying Examination by taking the marks in equal proportions, common rank list will be prepared and published for the above courses.

d) For admission to Bachelor of Veterinary Science & Animal Husbandry course candidates who have obtained an aggregate minimum of 50% marks in Physics, Chemistry, Biology and English subjects in Qualifying Examination are eligible. (40% for SC, ST, Cat-1, 2A, 2B, 3A and 3B category candidates)

Based on the performance of the candidates in Physics, Chemistry and Biology subjects in the Common Entrance Test, the B.V.Sc. & A.H. rank list will be prepared and published for admission to B.V.Sc. & A.H. courses.

e) For admission to B-Pharma candidates should have passed 2nd PUC / 12thStd in Physics, Chemistry, Biology / Physics Chemistry, Mathematics (PCM /PCB) with minimum 45% marks in aggregate for GM candidates, 40% for SC/ST, Category-I and OBC or passed Diploma in Pharmacy examination from an Institution approved by the Pharmacy council of India under section 12 of the Pharmacy act and has secured a minimum of 45% of marks for GM candidates (40% for SC/ST, Category-I and OBC (2A, 2B, 3A and 3B)candidates).

Merit will be determined on the basis of performance of the candidates in Physics, Chemistry and Biology subjects or Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics subjects i.e., PCB or PCM marks whichever is highest in Common Entrance Test 2025. Common rank list will be prepared and published separately for admission to B-Pharma.

Candidates who have passed Diploma in Pharmacy course seeking admission to B-Pharma should compulsorily submit their photocopy of D-Pharma (final year) Marks card on which CET number boldly written to KEA on or before 30-05-2025. Failing which Rank will not be assigned to the candidate.

f) For admission to Pharma-D : Candidates should have passed in 2nd PUC / 12th Std with Physics, Chemistry and Biology or Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics or passed in Diploma in Pharmacy examination from an Institution approved by the Pharmacy Council of India under Section 12 of the Pharmacy Act.

Merit will be determined on the basis of performance of the candidates in Physics, Chemistry and Biology subjects or Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics subjects i.e., PCB or PCM marks whichever is highest in the Common Entrance Test 2025. Common rank list will be prepared and published separately for admission to Pharma-D.

Further, the candidates seeking admission to B.Pharma, Pharma-d and Naturopathy & Yoga courses, should have completed the age of Seventeen Years as on 31st December of 2025.

Candidates who have passed Diploma in Pharmacy course seeking admission to Pharma-D should compulsorily submit their photocopy of D-Pharma (final year) Marks card on which CET number boldly written to KEA on or before 30-05-2025, failing which Rank will not be assigned to the candidate.

Candidates who have passed Diploma in Pharmacy course seeking admission to 2nd year B-Pharma (Lateral Entry) should compulsorily submit their photocopy of D-Pharma (final year) Marks card on which CET number boldly written to KEA on or before 30-04-2025. Failing which Rank will not be assigned to the candidate.

IMPORTANT: IF the qualifying marks change due to any reason after verification of documents or allotment of a seat, and candidate becomes ineligible due to change of qualifying marks, it is the responsibility of candidate to inform KEA authority for withdrawal of rank or cancellation of rank or for cancellation of a seat allotted if any. Neither KEA nor Government will take the responsibility if the candidature or seat is rejected by any University / Competent Authority due to non-eligibility for a particular course in the future. Further, the seat allotment made by KEA shall be subject to approval by the concerned University / Competent Authority.

NOTE:

- Candidates who do not pass in all the subjects in the qualifying examination and candidates who do not possess the academic eligibility detailed above for various Professional Courses, will not be eligible to be considered for allotment of seats in the respective courses.
- A candidate who passes in all the subjects in the qualifying examination and later withdraws one or more subject for reappearing in the qualifying examination for improving his performance will also not be considered for allotment of seats in the regular round and will be treated as a supplementary candidate.
- Not only a candidate who has passed the qualifying examination with requisite marks but also a candidate who is appearing for the Q.E. and expecting the results is eligible to apply for the Common Entrance Test – 2025.
- Students appearing for Karnataka 2nd PUC Annual 2025 need not submit their Q. E. marks card to the KEA, as it will be obtained directly from the Department of PUE. However, all other students who have passed Karnataka 2ND PUC / 12th standard before 2025 and those who are appearing for 2025 annual 12th standard examination (such as CBSE, CISCE, 10+2, from other boards, including J & K) in 2025 should enter the marks details through online in the KEA Web-portal or must COMPULSORILY send a photocopy of their 12th standard marks card by mentioning their CET Number to KEA. Repeater students of Karnataka 2nd PU also should submit their photocopy of the marks card immediately after the exam before 30-04-2025. Otherwise, the results of such candidates will be withheld for want of Q. E. Marks. Intermediary ranks / Spot ranks will be assigned in respect of with-held candidates only after submission of photocopy of the Q. E. marks card.

9. MORE ABOUT THE WRITTEN TEST – METHOD OF CET-2025

(i). SYLLABUS

The question papers of the Common Entrance Test will be based on the First and Second PUC syllabi prescribed by the Department of Pre-University Education of Karnataka State.

Regarding the syllabus to be adopted for Common Entrance Test-2025, the subject experts of the Department of School Education (Pre-University) have reviewed the Syllabus of PCMB subjects adopted for the 1st and 2nd PUC classes in Karnataka state and the syllabus to be adopted for CET-2025 has been published on the KEA Website for the information of the students.

(ii). DURATION, QUESTION PAPER AND OMR ANSWER SHEETS

The Common Entrance Test will be held on TWO days in FOUR different sessions for four subjects. On the first day, test will be conducted for Physics and Chemistry subjects in two sessions and on the next day test will be conducted for Mathematics and Biology subjects in two sessions as per the date and time notified. Each paper / subject will be conducted for 60 marks each with duration of 80 minutes.

Each question paper will be of Multiple Choice Questions (Objective) type. The question paper in each subject will have different versions and each question will have four different options. Each question will carry ONE mark. The candidate is expected to attempt all the questions, in order to obtain maximum marks. In other words, there is no choice of questions. THERE WILL BE NO NEGATIVE EVALUATION WITH REGARD TO WRONG / INCORRECT ANSWERS BUT MARKS WILL NOT BE AWARDED IN RESPECT OF MULTIPLE ANSWERS for the same question. The version code of the question paper will be boldly printed on facing sheet of the question paper.

The version code of the question papers given to a student may be different OR may be the same for different sessions.

(III). OPTICAL MARK READER SHEETS AS ANSWER SHEETS

A model of the Optical Mark Reader (OMR) sheets that will be used for marking the answers by the candidates is hosted on the KEA Website. The need for the replica has compelled us to design OMR sheet in such a way that all the information and the answers are marked only on one side. The top portion of the sheet is meant for furnishing the particulars about the candidates such as the Name, CET Number, Version code and serial number of the question booklet. The bottom portion is meant for marking the answers, affixing the signature of the room Invigilator & candidates and also for affixing the Left Hand Thumb Impression of the candidate. The space meant for the subject would have been pre-marked. The square blocks in each item should be filled by the candidate in capital letters and numbers. The circles corresponding to the letters or numbers are meant to be completely shaded using blue or black ink ballpoint pen only.

iv. SPECIMEN OF THE OMR ANSWER SHEET

A Specimen of the OMR answer sheet will be hosted on the KEA Website <http://cetonline.karnataka.gov.in/kea/>. Please study the specimen OMR answer sheet hosted on the KEA Website, download and familiarize yourself. Take four to five photocopies of the specimen OMR sheet and practice on them at home. By using blue or black ink ballpoint, candidates can practice with the OMR answer sheet with regard to filling and shading of the required items. By doing so, you will be very accurate in writing and shading the particulars such as Name, CET Number, Question booklet version code, etc., in the required manner on the Original OMR answer sheets, during actual conduct of the test. More details about precautions to be taken while filling the particulars on OMR answer sheets are given below:

- (i) The OMR answer sheet comprises of two sheets.
- (ii) The upper sheet is to be used for the purpose of marking correct answers and later scanning & evaluation and the lower sheet will be returned to the candidates after completion of each session of the test. The lower sheet is coated with a special kind of chemical which acts as a Carbon paper. When the candidate shades the circles on the upper sheet, the pressure on the lower sheet will automatically create a replica of the top sheet.

Why Ball Point Pen?

Remember we are allowing the candidates to carry replica or facsimile of the OMR Answer Sheet. OMR Answer Sheet comes in set of two sheets. When you shade the top sheet, the pressure will create a dark mark on the bottom sheet on the corresponding circle. If a pen with a nib is used, the pressure on the top sheet will not be sufficient to activate the chemical on the bottom sheet. On the other hand, a ball point pen exerts sufficient pressure to convert the bottom sheet chemical into a dark spot. That is why we want you to use a blue or black ink ballpoint pen only.

V. IMPORTANT PRECAUTIONS TO BE TAKEN WHILE WRITING / SHADING TOP PORTION OF OMR ANSWER SHEET:

(A) INITIAL 10 MINUTES:

In all the four sessions, the initial TEN minutes will be given for the candidates to write / shade the particulars such as Name, CET Number, Version Code and Serial number of the question booklet on the OMR answer sheets in the boxes provided. **OMR answer sheets in which the candidates do not write / shade the correct CET Number and Version code on the OMR Answer Sheet will not be scanned and such candidates will not be assigned any rank.** The entries pertaining to 'Name', 'CET Number' and 'Question booklet Version code' are very crucial ones. Therefore, candidates are advised to take extra precaution while writing and shading these three items accurately on the top portion of the OMR answer sheet.

The candidates will have to mark correct options on the Optical Mark Reader (OMR) answer sheet, which will be supplied at the beginning of each session of the test. Each question will have only one correct answer. The candidate shall mark the correct answer by completely shading only one circle against a question number, using BLUE or BLACK ink ball point pen.

(B) NEXT 70 MINUTES:

Important precautions to be taken while shading answers on bottom portion of OMR Answer sheet.

After the initial TEN minutes, 70 minutes will be given to a candidate for shading the answers on the bottom portion of the OMR answer sheet. On the bottom portion, there will be 60 rows corresponding to 60 questions. Against each question number, four circles will be provided corresponding to four options of the question paper. The candidates are required to shade only one circle corresponding to the correct answer.

The scanner is so sensitive to black and blue ink shades that even a slight residual ink mark or an unintended ink dot within a circle on the OMR answer sheet will be taken by it, as filled / shaded, at the time of scanning. Consequently, the candidate may lose marks. Therefore, please do not make any stray pen marks on the OMR answer sheets. As the scoring done by the scanner and the computer in tandem is final, a plea for erasing or neglecting the ink mark on a circle cannot be entertained. Therefore, candidates are advised to take extra precaution while shading the circles on the bottom portion.

(C) END OF PAPER FOR EACH SESSION:

The candidates are required to COMPULSORILY AFFIX THEIR LEFT HAND THUMB IMPRESSION in the space provided on the bottom portion of the OMR answer sheet of the upper with the ink-pad provided by the room Invigilator, after completion of each Session of the Test. However, they need not affix their thumb impression on the lower sheet i.e., the replica of the OMR answer sheet. Thereafter, the invigilators will detach the lower sheet from the upper sheet at the perforations and hand over the lower sheet replica to the candidates and candidates are allowed to carry the same with them. The upper sheet will be retained by the invigilator for returning the same to the Deputy Chief Superintendent of the examination center and in turn to KEA.

NOTE: The OMR answer sheets in respect of all the candidates who have affixed their left hand thumb impression will only be scanned and the results in respect of such candidates will be published. The OMR answer sheets in respect of candidates who have not affixed their left hand thumb impression, for any reason, will not be scanned. Also, the results in respect of such candidates will not be published.

THINK BEFORE YOU INK !

Once you darken a circle, there is no way to erase or to remove it. That way, your decision about a correct answer will be final. The invigilator will not permit you to use marker, white fluid or any other device to hide the shading already done and you will not be supplied with one more set of OMR sheet. If you spoil a sheet in your attempt to rub off the shading done on a circle, you may ruin your opportunities. If two circles are shaded in a row and even if one of the circles is partially rubbed off, the scanner will take it as a multiple attempt. Therefore, think twice before you shade a circle with ink. Darken only one circle for each question as shown against the CORRECT METHOD.

Provided that where merit of two or more candidates is same, the interse merit shall be determined with reference to the marks obtained in the Aptitude test; where marks obtained in 1[National Aptitude Test for Architecture (NATA) conducted by Council of Architecture]1 are equal, then the interse merit shall be determined on the basis of marks obtained in Mathematics in the qualifying examination and where marks obtained in Mathematics are equal, the interse merit shall be determined on the basis of the age of the candidate, the elder candidate placed above the younger.

NOTE: If everything as specified in the provisions to sub-clauses referred to above i.e. (A) 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 are equal, then the interse merit will be determined by draw of lots. The determination of interse merit as detailed above for selection of Government seats will be the basis for the merit list of candidates claiming benefit of reservation under Admission Rules.

(B) PUBLICATION OF MERIT LISTS:

After the completion of the entrance test, the Provisional ANSWER KEY will be published on **the dates** notified by KEA on the KEA Website: <http://http://cetonline.karnataka.gov.in/kea/> The candidates / parents / lecturers can file their objections, if any, only through online, with regard to any of the published answer Key, along with all supporting documents / justification. The objections received by the KEA will be placed before an Expert Committee, whose decision will be final for determination of the right answer key. The answer key approved by the Expert Committee will be applied during evaluation for determination of merit order.

As per the merit determined by the KEA, Engineering, Architecture, Farm Science, B-Pharm and Pharm-D ranks will be assigned to the eligible candidates. Separate result sheets showing the Engineering, Architecture, Farm science, B-Pharm and Pharm-D ranks will be published on **the notified date** on KEA Website <http://http://cetonline.karnataka.gov.in/kea/>. The correct answer key and the list of candidates whose results have been withheld and the reasons for withholding the results will also be published along with the results. The candidates whose results are with-held for want of 2nd PUC / 12th std. Marks and date of birth such candidates / parents need not worry because, ranks will be assigned as and when they submit the required documents on the specified dates during office hours.

Result sheets will not be displayed in the KEA premises.

Candidates who have any objections in respect of any of the entries or issues or discrepancies in the result sheets, such as discrepancy / changes in the Q. E. marks, version code, NEET / NATA scores etc., except the marks secured in the Common Entrance Test, can submit their objections within three days from the date of publication of the CET - 2025 result and thereafter result will be published for such candidates. (See box item given below for details about intermediary ranks / Spot ranks i.e., ranks ending with G55, G44, G33 etc.)

NOTE: (1) The candidates are requested to verify their qualifying examination details displayed on the result sheets without fail, if there is any discrepancy with reference to qualifying examination marks the same should be brought to the notice of this office immediately for fresh assignment of ranks, if any.
(2) Candidates whose results will be withheld for want of qualifying examination marks should enter their marks to KEA portal and the ranks in respect of such candidates will be published subsequently.

(C) Request for re-totaling or revaluation of the OMR answer sheets will not be entertained, as the valuation and the subsequent scoring will be error free.

What does 'G 55' mean?

After the declaration of the results, the candidates may not get ranks assigned mainly for the following reasons :

- (1) For want of Q. E. marks, a candidate might have missed the rank.
- (2) A candidate might have marked the version code wrongly.
- (3) Q. E. marks may change due to revaluation or otherwise, when corrected, a fresh ranking becomes necessary.

The KEA computers are programmed to assign new ranks or fresh ranks to the candidates falling within the above said categories without disturbing the rank numbers assigned to the candidates whose results were declared earlier. The computer program is such that it can assign ranks in between two integers without altering the previous rank numbers. Undoubtedly, you were assigned a rank after the declaration of the results. When a rank was assigned to you, rank 1234 and 1235 had been assigned to two other candidates. When it came to assigning a rank to you, the computer found that in the normal course, your rank would have been after the candidate with rank 1234 and before the candidate with rank 1235. Therefore, the computer had to place you between 1234 and 1235. As already said, the computer is programmed to generate large number of ranks between two integers by dividing the space alphabetically from A to Z. Then each alphabet is subdivided from 1 to 99. Now, if a new rank is required to be assigned between two integer ranks, in the first instance, the computer assigns a division number as 'G 55' before the previous rank. If one more rank needs to be assigned between the rank 1234 and 1234 G 55, the computer assigns a rank as 1234 G 44. If one more rank is to be assigned between 1234 G 55 and 1235, then it assigns a rank as 1234 G 66.

Based on the performance of the candidates in the Common Entrance Test / NATA and the Qualifying Examination, as the case may be, the merit / rank list will be prepared and published. All the eligible candidates will be considered for allotment of seats in the order of their merit / rank and based on the options and as per the seat matrix issued by the Government.

(Annexure-II to this rule is reuploaded for the information of the candidates and parents) Provided that candidates belonging to SC, ST & Category - I should produce an Income certificate issued by Jurisdictional Tahasildar in the prescribed format appended to this brochure. (This is for the purpose of processing eligibility of candidates to claim Tuition Fee exemption and Government of India scholarship). - Online seat allotment for admission to various Professional Courses for the year 2025, will be based on the claims made by the candidates in their online application form and submission of supporting documents / certificates by the eligible candidates.
- Hence, candidates are advised to be ready with all the necessary certificates / documents as per the claims in online application or to claim eligibility and reservation benefits.
- The candidate should possess all necessary original documents with them in support of their claim made in the online application. If any candidate fails to produce any of the documents / certificates / marks card, such candidates will not get eligibility to exercise the options for seat allotment.

Eg:

- If a candidate is belonging to 3A caste category reservation and fails to enter the RD number of Caste-Income certificate of 3A issued by the concerned Tahasildar, then he / she will not be eligible to claim 3A reservation.
- If a candidate mentioned as 'YES' for Rural reservation in the online application, but fails to produce Rural Study Certificate for having studied 1 to 10th standard in the rural areas issued by the Competent Authority, then such candidate will not be eligible to claim Rural Reservation.
- Further General Merit students should obtain NCLC from the concerned Tahasildar (RD number needs to be entered in the application for online verification)
- Likewise, submission of relevant certificate / documents is mandatory to claim any reservation benefits; candidates will become ineligible to be considered under that particular reservation due to non-submission of the relevant certificates / documents.
- Even though a candidate is eligible to claim Rural Reservation, but he / she has not claimed in the online application then he / she will not be eligible to claim such reservation. Furthermore, candidates will not be eligible for any type of reservation if it is not claimed in the online application.

NOTE:

- Verify candidate name, father name, mother name printed on the certificates / marks cards etc.
- Study Certificate should contain the details about study period and years. BEO / DDPU counter Signature is compulsory on the study certificate.
- Check the date of issue of Caste / Caste Income Certificate. Check the validity of the Caste / Caste Income Certificate.
- Check the RD number printed on the Caste certificate / Caste Income certificate / Income Certificate / 371(j) Kalyana Karnataka-Annexure-A. Without RD number candidates cannot be eligible to claim reservation.

- Caste / Caste Income Certificate of Karnataka State only. Migrant Certificate and OBC certificate issued by Central Government is not valid for admissions through KEA; it should be in Form-F for 2A, 2B, 3A, 3B reservations, Form-E for Category-1 and Form-D for SC / ST reservations.
- Category-1 and SC or ST candidate should also submit income certificate to avail the benefit of fee exemption as per Government norms. IF they fail to enter the RD Number of income certificate they will not be eligible to claim fee exemption benefit.

19. A NOTE ON SEAT CANCELLATION, REFUND AND FORFEITURE OF FEE

As per Rule 12 of Karnataka Selection of Candidates for Admission to Government Seats in Professional Educational Institutions Rules, 2006,

- (1) If a candidate who has been allotted a seat in any discipline in the First Round or in the Second Round and who has reported to the college, wishes to surrenders / cancel the seat before the last date notified for entry of options for the Second Extended Round / Casual Vacancy Round, the Executive Director, shall deduct Rs.5,000/- as processing fee and refund the remaining fee paid.
- (2) If a candidate who has been allotted a seat in any discipline (except Engineering) in the First Round or in the Second Round and who has reported to the college or not, surrenders the seat after the completion of Second Extended Round / Casual Vacancy Round the Executive Director, shall forfeit the entire fee paid.
- (3) The candidate who surrenders the seat (except Engineering) allotted in the Second Extended Round / Casual Vacancy Round / final round / mop-up round, the Executive Director shall forfeit the entire fee paid.
- (4) As per rule 12 (2) of CET-2006 rules, payment of penalty is mandatory and no exemption on penalty payment to any category candidate.
If a Candidate who has been allotted a seat in any discipline in an Engineering College or Institution under sub-rule (4) of rule 10 surrenders the seat after completion of respective Casual Vacancy Round, the Executive Director shall forfeit the entire fee paid and the candidate shall be liable to pay a penalty of five times of the fee.
- (5) if a candidate does not surrender the allotted a seat in any discipline in an Engineering College or Institution under sub-rule (4) of rule 10 or fail to join the allotted college even after the completion of the Casual Vacancy Round, the Executive Director, Karnataka Examinations Authority shall forfeit the entire fee amount paid by the candidates and the candidate shall be liable to pay a penalty of five times of the fee.
- (6) If a candidate reports to the college and later on leaves the college he / she have to necessarily surrender the seat back to KEA only. It is the endeavor of KEA to see that subsidized Government Quota seats are accessible and available to all meritorious students. Hence failing to surrender the seat back to KEA will be viewed as a breach of contract and severe lack of social responsibility.
- (7) No surrender or cancellation of seat shall be accepted, unless the candidate surrenders the original admission order issued by the KEA, original Bank Challan and original Verification Slip.
- (8) If a candidate does not surrender / cancel / fails to join the allotted college (except engineering) even after the completion of the Second Extended Round / Casual Vacancy Round the Executive Director, Karnataka Examinations Authority shall forfeit the entire fee amount paid by the candidates.

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS ON OPTION ENTRY:

The options entered by the candidate for the first round will remain same for all the rounds of seat allotment. The candidates will not be allowed to enter options again. Option Entry done before the first round will be the final list of options. The priority of options entered by the candidate will be shown on the option entry module by obtaining the candidate credentials. Candidate may delete or alter order of higher options. The candidate will be allowed to add new options for any colleges and course that came into the seat matrix after the first round.

Further, follow the guidelines and instructions to be published on the KEA Website with regard to each round of seat allotment.

CANCELLATION OF SEAT:

- IF a candidate chooses to withdraw the seat in which he has given admission, he has to follow the instructions within the time specified for each round and the request for cancellation of a seat should be submitted before the time specified for each round.
- It is made clear that, if a candidate submits the request after the expiry of the period specified for cancellation will not be entertained.
- The candidates shall apply online for cancellation and submit the required details through online mode only by using the candidate credentials. Upon such receipt of cancellation, action would be taken to cancel the seat as per rules.
- Candidate has to state the genuine reason for cancellation of a seat by stating the valid reason.
- If a candidate request for cancellation after the period specified for cancellation, legal action will be initiated as per rules.

Steps and procedure to be followed for cancellation will be notified later.
